




# Daecheongdam Certification Center— Buyong Sports Park

Distance: 21km / Estimated time: 80 minutes

The Geumgang (River) bicycle path that starts from the vast artificial lake called "Daecheongdam". The deck bicycle path, which runs along the cliff adjoining two-lane road, runs for 3km, standing 70 or 80m above the river. Despite its meandering trails, a magnific landscape spreads out below, with willow trees rooted in the side of the cliff along the river. The bicycle path lying along the peripheral areas of Daejeon runs north and enters Cheongwon-gun, Chungcheongbuk-do.








Distance: 16km

Estimated time: 60 minutes

The Geumgang bicycle path converges with Mihocheon at Hapgang-ri, in the City of Sejong, and then runs along the levee of Geumgang. Sejong is a newly built special administrative city of the ROK. Along Geumgang (River), 8 pavilions called "Geumgang Paljeong" can be seen, from which you can enjoy a glance at the beautiful landscape surrounding the river. Among the pavilions, Hapgangjeong (Pavilion) and Dongnakjeong (Pavilion) stand out. The path is leveled and features a vast willow forest, providing an ideal spot to appreciate the landscape surrounding Geumgang.










# Sejong

The City of Sejong is a multi-functional administrative city built to lead Korea's balanced national development and to set an example as a sustainable city. The city is able to accommodate a large population and attract diverse businesses. It was built for a total population of 0.5 million. The downtown of the city was designed as a space for the public to use and to relax in, and more than 50% of its area was planned as a space with waterfront in order to complete the vision of an eco-friendly space. Currently, some enterprises and

government organizations have relocated to Sejong City. The city will be completed by 2030.

# 3-4 Sejongbo Certification Center — Geumganggyo

Distance: 19km / Estimated time: 80 minutes

The City of Sejong, which features sprawling bicycle paths with Geumgang bicycle path at its heart, is a magnet for cyclists. Geumgang bicycle path, which stretches out of Sejongbo (Weir), immediately leads to the City of Gongju via a bicycle path along the national road. The bicycle path enters Gongju, the 2nd capital of Baekje Dynasty, and takes you to Seokjangni Museum, where artifacts of the Old Stone Age are on display. The road then runs along Geumgang's levee and crosses Geumganggyo (Bridge) in Gongju.








# Gapsa

Gapsa (Temple), located at the foot of Gyeryongsan (Mt.), has operated a one night and two days temple stay program through which tourists can experience daily temple life. There are many programs including therapeutic walks in the woods and Buddhist martial arts. Tourists can also participate in a pottery program if they enroll in advance. The experience program where visitors can take a rubbing of "Wolinseokbo Panmok", Treasure 582, is particularly popular and very famous.



The bicycle path stretching from

Geumganggyo (Bridge) leads to Gongsanseong (Fortress), where you can learn about Baekje, a kingdom that thrived about 1,500 years ago. Next, the bicycle path will take you to Gongju National Museum, where Songsanri Ancient Tombs and Royal Tomb of King Muryeong are situated, and artifacts excavated from Royal Tomb of King Muryeong are on display. If you ride past the museum, you will find the 280 meterlong Gongjubo (Weir).











# Songsanri Ancient Tombs and Royal Tomb of King Muryeong

This representative historic site preserves the culture that flourished when Gongju was the capital of the Baekje Dynasty. There are seven royal tombs where kings and queens are buried. Many relics that reveal glimpses of the flourishing Baekje Dynasty, such as gold crowns, were discovered in the Royal Tomb of King Muryeong, one of the seven royal tombs.

Tourists can also see the inside a royal tomb. Although some of the royal tombs are closed to the public, visitors can look at excavated relics in the model exhibition hall that are recreated at the same scale as the actual tombs.

## 5 6 Mansugyo — Wangjingyo

Distance : 14km Estimated time : 60 minutes

When you ride past the river banks of Geumgang below Gongjubo, you will find Buyeo, the 3rd capital of Baekje Dynasty. The bicycle path leading to Buyeo is a combination of meandering and straight courses. Riding along the bicycle path, you will be able to overlook the vastly stretching out levee road against the backdrop of a picturesque landscape while feeling the breeze. What a romantic ride!











# Tancheon Jangseungje

Jangseung is a human-shaped pole that stands at the entrance of villages or temples and borders the villages, which is thought to be a guardian for the villages. Tancheon Jangseungje is a unique folk ritual that originated from Baekje, and is a ceremony in which male Jangseung and female Jangseung sleep together on Jeongwol Daeboreum (January 15 of the lunar calendar) for the well-being and prosperity of the village. Tancheon Jangseungje, which has lasted for over 400 years, has been maintained as a folk religion and a folk game.





#### Wangjingyo - Buyeodaegyo

Distance: 14km / Estimated time: 60 minutes

The Geumgang bicycle path that entered Buyeo leads to Baekjebo (Weir), which takes the shape of General Gyebaek, overlooking Baekmagang (River) while riding on a horse. The bicycle path diverges from Baekmaganggyo (Bridge), and then circles around Busosan (Mt.) and reverts to Gudraenaru (Ferry) before running along the levee road. After crossing the Baekmaganggyo, the bicycle path leads to the riverside road lined with poplar trees. It then circles around Busan (Mt.) and crosses Baekjedaegyo (Bridge) to converge with the bicycle path that starts at Gudraenaru (Ferry).







# Busosanseong

This mountain fortress surrounds
Busosan (Mt.) with Baekmagang (River)
running beside its wall. Legend says that,
at Nakhwaam (Rock), 3,000 ladies of the
court threw themselves from the top of
the cliff into the river. The fortress was
assumed to be built to protect the palace
after the capital of the Baekje Dynasty
was moved from Gongju to Buyeo. The
view of the scenery from Sajaru (Pavilion)
on top of Busosan (Mt.) is beautiful
beyond all description.



Banjowonnaru (Ferry) immediately leads to Nonsan.








# Baekmagang

Geumgang (River), which meanders around Buyeo, Chungcheongnam-do, is also called Baekmagang (River), and is about 16km long, running from Cheonjeongdae in Hoam-ri, Gyuam-myeon, Buyeo-gun to Nakhwaam, Gudraenaru (Ferry), Gyuamnaru (Ferry) and Banjowon-ri, Sedo-myeon. If you stop at the riverside road lined with polar trees near Wangheungsaji (Temple) in the early morning, you will be able to appreciate the beautiful landscape provided by Baekmagang.







## Ganggyeongpogu — Iksanseongdangpogu Certification Center

Distance: 11km / Estimated time: 45 minutes

Geumgang, which grows wider after Buyeo, looms large like the sea when it reaches Ganggyeongpogu (Inlet). The bicycle path that enters Iksan-si, Jeollanam-do, via Ganggyeongpogu, runs past Nabawu Holy Ground and Seongdangpogu (Inlet) Village.

Seongdangpogu Village is home to rare wild flowers and Crypsinus hastatus.



# Ganggyeongpogu Jeotgal Market

The market was one of the three major markets of Korea, along with Pyeongyang Market and Daegu Market, so it has historically meaningful buildings and spaces. Ganggyeong has been the nation's largest jeotgal (salted seafood) producer since the Joseon Dynasty. It is known that over 60% of jeotgal consumed by Koreans is marketed through Ganggyeong. Ganggyeong Jeotgal Festival is held in late autumn and early winter, right before Gimjang season.







## 9 10 Iksanseongdangpogu Certification Center - Gomgaenaru Park

Distance: 11km / Estimated time: 50 minutes

Once you receive your certification at Iksanseongdangpogu Certification Center, you will have to pass through a village located below the levee. After that, you will be headed toward a hill that reaches a mere 48m above sea level but is significantly steep. So you may need to gather your strength before climbing the hill. Riding past the levee road, you will see a prison set for film and TV shoots and Gomgaenaru (Ferry), which provides a ferry service. If you have a tent, it will be better to stay overnight at the auto camping site around Gomgaenaru.









# Hansan Sogokju

A traditional liquor brewed in Hansan in the Seocheon area, Hansan Sogokju has been designated as Chungcheongnamdo province's Intangible Cultural Asset no. 3. It is said that 1500 years ago it was enjoyed by the royal family of the Baekje Dynasty. Hansan Sogokju is sweet and fragrant and has a soft yellow color. It is particularly enjoyed for its subtle and unique fragrance that comes from wild chrysanthemums. Its alcohol content is 18%, so people can enjoy it without fear of intoxication. Known to purify blood and help vasodilatation, Hansan Sogokju is also used as a medicine. There is a famous manufacturing plant for this beverage around Hansan Mosi Center. #### Gomgaenaru Park — Geumgang Hagutduk Certification Center

Distance: 13km / Estimated time: 50 minutes

The bicycle path runs past deck roads at several points and then reaches the levee road overlooking Napoteul in southern Geumgang. Riding past Geumgangdaegyo (Bridge), which crosses Geumgang through a connection with Seohaean Expressway, you will find Geumgang Migratory Bird Observatory. The district that runs from the migratory bird observatory to Geumgang Hagutduk (Estuary Levee), the destination of the bicycle path trip, is home to winter migratory birds, and hundreds of thousands of migratory birds can be seen here in early November of each year. When the sun sets, tens of thousands of spectacled teals dance around before leaving for Seocheon and Gunsan to search for something to eat, which is quite an impressive sight. When you receive a stamp at the bicycle path certification center, your trip is over.



## Seocheon Fish Market

Seocheon Fish Market is a modern fish market equipped with stores, an outdoor market building, a cafeteria and various convenience facilities. Fresh seafood from the coastal waters of Seocheon, agricultural goods, general goods and apparel are sold at the market. Many tourists visit the market from Boryeong, Gunsan and Iksan, as they can buy fresh seafood at affordable prices.


The Cheongnamdae is a presidential vacation villa located near Daecheongdam. Cheongnamdae, which had been closed to the public for twenty years, was finally opened to the public on April 18, 2003 by former president Roh Moo-hyun. Visitors can view a music fountain inside the ecological wetland garden (990m²), hike a 3.3km mountain trail and visit the Hoban Promenade (8km), or simply take a pleasant walk along a beautiful trail, and enjoy the scenic landscape of Daecheongho (Lake).






## Baekje Cultural Festival





## Changing of the Guards



## Soy Sauce Marinated Crab

Blue crabs are left to age in soy sauce, and then boiled with soy source, water, spices, and medicinal herbs for 3 days.

People mix eggs in a crab shell and a half cup of freshly cooked rice, and wrap it all with roasted seaweed to eat.



# 1-2 Damyangdam Certification Center — Mahang Senior Care Center

Distance: 16,4km


Estimated time: 70 minutes

Yeongsangang bicycle path starts from Daeseonggyo (Bridge) below Damyangho (Lake). While riding the bike along the river levee, you will find a road densely lined with metasequoia trees and 2km – long Gwanbangjerim Levee Road. Gwanbangjerim is a tree belt lining the Damyang levee built during the Joseon Dynasty, which is comprised of hackberries, zelkova and cherry trees. On the opposite side of Gwanbangjerim lies Juknokwon, which has been designed to allow one to appreciate bamboo trees. You can find bicycle rental shops around Juknokwon.










#### Metasequoia Road

The path from Wonyul-ri, Geumseongmyeon, Damyang-gun to Damyang-gun Office that spans 8.5km is lined with about 1,500 metasequoia trees.

This beautiful tree-lined path is often featured in films, dramas and commercial shoots, and is considered a must-visit tourist attraction for taking photographs. The road has a different atmosphere whenever the season changes, giving tourists unique opportunities to enjoy the beautiful landscape throughout the year.





As you enjoy the picturesque landscape of the southern province, you will find yourself pedaling towards Damyang Wetland, Korea's leading ecological tourist attraction. Damyang Wetland is home to endangered species such as the falcon, wildcats and the narrow-mouthed toad, and natural monuments such as aix galericulata. You can find bicycle rental shops around the bamboo forest of the wetland. Once you pass through the bamboo forest, you will find the City of Gwangju.

#### Soswaewon

A heritage garden built in the Joseon Dynasty. This is a garden that stays true to the natural environment, with a minimal amount of man-created beauty, and features a waterfall and a pond that were formed by leading the water flowing down from the hill at the back. Jewoldang, which was a private space, and Gwangpunggak, which was used as a guest house, are the main buildings. Visitors can enjoy the panoramic view of Soswaewon at Daebongdae.

#### 3 4 Sandonggyo-Seochanggyo

Distance: 12km / Estimated time: 50 minutes

The part of Yeongsangang (River) that spans from Sandonggyo (Bridge) to Seochanggyo (Bridge) is called "Geungnakgang (or Paradise River)," which is named after a Yeogak (a kind of official hotel for foreign envoys and officials) of the Joseon Dynasty called "Geungnakwon." While riding past Geungnakgang in downtown Gwangju, you will notice a pavilion called "Pungyeongjeong (Pavilion)" on the opposite side of Gwangsindaegyo (Bridge). Against the backdrop of Geungnakgang, the landscape is very impressive.

#### Street of Art

Just like Seoul has Insa-dong, Gwangju also features a Street of Art. The Street of Art is a street with a length of approximately 300m running from the Dongbu Police Station to Jungang-ro, and features a number of art galleries, art supply stores, frame maker shops, antique shops, small-sized theaters and Korean traditional teahouses. It is designated as a car-free street every Saturday so that a variety of cultural events can be held in the street.



Yeongsangang (River) converges with Hwangnyonggang (River) via Seochangnaru (Ferry) and grows wider. The bicycle path is directed towards Seungchonbo (Weir), the destination in Gwangju. Seungcheonbo has the shape of a rice grain and includes a bicycle path certification center. An automobile camping site is situated nearby. The bicycle path stretching from Seungchonbo runs along a vast field and enters the City of Naju. If you tour the site in spring, you will be able to enjoy the beautiful landscape against the backdrop



of rape blossoms and pear blossoms.









#### Moksa Naea


This is a traditional Korean house that was used as an official residence for the highest official of Naju-mok, during the Joseon Dynasty. Unusually, it features a "L"-shaped structure rather than the widely used linear structure. In 2009, this building was renovated to be transformed into accommodations that enable guests to experience Korean traditional culture, and is currently very popular among visitors. The more than 500-year-old hackberry tree squeezing in between stone walls provides a picturesque view.



#### 5-6 Yeongsangyo - Juksanbo Certification Center Distance: 11km / Estimated time: 50 minutes


The Yeongsangang bicycle path that enters the city of Naju leads to Yeongsanpo (Inlet). Yeongsanpo had originally served as a port until 1977, when Hagutduk (Estuary Levee), designed to prevent flooding, was built. The lighthouse in Yeongsanpo is evidence that the place once served as a port. The lighthouse is known as the first one in Korea to be established by a river rather than the sea. Since then, the port has turned into Hongeo (Skate) Street. If you have the chance, sample some sliced raw skate and imagine what Yeongsanpo originally looked like. While riding along the Yeongsangang bicycle path, you will find Yeongmojeong (Pavilion). The pavilion, built in 1520, looks even more beautiful surrounded by 400-year-old hackberry trees. The bicycle path then leads to Juksanbo (Weir), the second weir built along Yeongsangang. Take a break at Juksanbo Certification Center.





#### Yeongsanpo Hongeo Street

Formerly the location of Yeongsanpo (Port), this street is home to Hongeo (Skate) specialized restaurants and skate wholesaler stores, and has become widely known as Hongeo Street. Usually, skates need to be fermented to be eaten. According to an old story, skates caught in the sea used to go bad frequently because it took more than 5 days to deliver them to Yeongsanpo, but people started to eat skates by fermenting them after seeing that a fisherman that had eaten a rotten skate didn't become sick at all. The quality of fermented skate depends on the method used to ferment it. Skates are now one of Yeongsanpo's specialties, and the Yeongsanpo Hongeo Festival is held every late April, attracting numerous visitors that come to Yeongsanpo to taste fermented stakes.

#### 6 Juksanbo Certification Center - Mongtandaegyo

Distance: 23km / Estimated time: 90 minutes

When you pedal toward the end of levee road, Naju Image Theme Park will come into sight. If you like watching films, the theme park deserve a visit. When you ride past Naju Image Theme Park, Seokgwanjeong (Pavilion) and Geumgangjeong (Pavilion) will come into sight. That is also called Dahae Port. At the port, you can board Hwangpo sailboat to enjoy Yeongsangang. If you ride past Dahae Port, you will be able to reach Neureoji, which is renowned for its fertile land, via Donggang-myeon, in the city of Naju. The term "Neureoji" refers to water current that slows. The S-shaped Yeongsangang, whose flowing speed slows in the face of protruded land, creates a splendid landscape. A bicycle path certification center is located nearby. In addition, observatory may be found in Neureoji Observatory Certification Center, overlooking the river landscape.






Mongtandaegyo connects Naju to Muan. The road that spans Mongtandaegyo to Sodaenginaru (Ferry) is 12km in length. With its remarkable landscape, it is justifiably considered one of the most significant Yeongsangang bicycle path. Particularly when autumn comes, the road overlooks an unforgettable landscape that features a combination of undulating yellow paddies and silver-colored reeds. Beside the levee road lies Hoesan Baengnyeonji, where you can take a break and enjoy the white lotus in full bloom.









#### Hoesan Baengnyeonji

This is the Asia's biggest white lotus habitat. It features a 280m long bridge across the pond, from which visitors can take a close look at white lotus flowers. Trails and shelters are prepared around the pond, and visitors can take boats out into the pond. A lotus festival is held here every July.

### 8-9 Sodaenginaru—Yeongsangang Hagutduk Certification Center

Distance: 19km / Estimated time: 75 minutes

Once you enter Sodaenginaru (Ferry), you will keep pedaling faster. Sodaenginaru, where only a few small boats are kept afloat, once served as a port where small boats transported people and freight to Yeongam-gun on the opposite side. Once you ride past it, the road will diverge. So be careful. If you turn right and enter the vehicle road to ride past the village and take the riverside road, the vast Yeongsanho (Lake) will come into sight. You can see the sun set against the background of Yeongsanho in Mangwol-ri, Illo-eup, where Yeongsangang Hagutduk Certification Center is located. If you keep pedaling faster, you will find Yeongsangang Hagutduk (Estuary Levee) around Yeongsangang. That is the destination of Yeongsangang bicycle path. If you receive a stamp at the certification center located around Hagutduk, your bicycle trip will end. If you feel like going somewhere else from here, you might enjoy a tour of Mokpo, a seaport city.



#### Gatbawi

Located on the coast of Yonghae-dong in Mokpo, Gatbawi is a natural sandstone and tafoni formation near the mouth of the Yeongsangang, where freshwater runs into the sea. Gatbawi is named after its shape, which is said to look like a man wearing a traditional Korean hat called a "gat" ("bawi" meaning "rock"). The rock is actually made of two individual formations: one measuring 8m high and one 6m high. Valued not only for its aesthetics, Gatbawi is of high geological value as a "natural sculpture" that was formed as a result of years of weathering. The rock formation was officially recognized as Natural Monument No. 500 on April 27, 2009.

#### SCENERY

Gwanbangjerim is a forest that was made along the banks of Damyangcheon (Stream). Gwanbangjerim is a special man-made forest that was planted to prevent flooding along Damyangcheon. It is comprised of large trees such as muku trees, zelkova trees, nettle trees, and cherry trees that are about 200 to 300 years old. The forest's beauty is so well known that it was even selected as "Korea's most beautiful forest" by the Korean Forest Services, Visitors enjoy this gorgeous natural getaway all year round, with many stopping by the forest Sculpture Park for pictures. #### Damyangho

Damyangho (Lake) is a huge artificial lake and features an embankment with a height of 46m and a length of 316m. It has a fine view thanks to its location next to Chuwolsan (Mt.) and Geumseongsan (Mt.), and a variety of fish species such as pond smelt, catfish, snakehead, carp and leather carp live in its clean water. This large bamboo forest is by the Hyanggyo along the Damyangcheon (Stream) and Gwanbangjerim (Forest). 


#### Korea International Circuit









#### How to Use the Unattended Certification Centers

- 1 First, check that there is a stamp in the booth.
- 2 Then, stamp your passport on the corresponding page.
- 3 Just in case you need more evidence to prove that you were really there, take a photo in front of the booth!











#### When riding on the road

- 1 If there is a right turn lane, shift to the other lane and pass through.
- 2 If one lane allows both a right turn and to go straight, ride on the left side of the right lane.
- 3 If you stay on the right side of the right lane, you may crash with a vehicle that is turning right.
- 4 If the lane is narrow, it is safer to ride on the center lane (A) rather than riding on the right side of the lane (B).
- 5 It is dangerous to ride moving in and out of the spaces between parked cars.
- 6 The directions that the dotted lines show are the drivers' usual direction of sight. Driving the wrong way in this case is dangerous because there is possibility for a head-on collision with the car taking a right turn.
- 7 Driver A may not see the bike rider due to vehicle B. Also, you must ride at least 1m away from vehicle B in case the driver door.
